Jamboree Division

- Each Team can have a maximum of 16 players. This includes two *non-Aboriginal players*.
- All Youth Players must be 14 – 17. Players must be 14 on or before March 26, 2010 and no older than 18 on or before December 31, 2010
- Parents must sign a waiver for their child to play in the tournament.
- All tournament participants (players, coaches, managers) including the youth division, will be required to pay the daily tournament admission fee to enter the arena's.
- Travel subsidies will be issued for Yukon participating teams from outside of Whitehorse.
- Players/coaches must be registered with a Hockey Canada Association (YAHA, Hockey North, WMHA, etc) to play in the tournament. If a player is not registered through a minor hockey association they can register through the Yukon Aboriginal Sport Circle for a cost of \$55.00/player with the attached form. This is a requirement to play in the tournament for insurance reasons, if one player/coach is not registered, then the insurance for the youth tournament becomes null and void.
- Coaches must also have taken Hockey Canada's Coach Stream/Initiation and speak out courses, these course will be offered prior to the tournament starting for those coaches who do not have the course. This course will be offered free of charge.

**** Rep Team (Mustangs AA/AWG players) – each team is allowed 3 rep team players. Only one of the rep team players is allowed to be non-aboriginal. Female Aboriginal Rep Team players do not fall under this Rep Team/AWG Players rule. Any player playing Midget, Bantam, Pee wee or Atom AAA, AA, A (Major or Minor) are considered Rep team players, this includes out of territory players. ****

***** Junior players are not eligible for the Youth division, Aboriginal or non-Aboriginal*****

**Yukon Indian Hockey Association
Jamboree Tournament Rules
March 26-28, 2010**

1. Youth must be 14 – 17 years old. Players must be a minimum of age 14 on or before March 26, 2010 and be no older than 18 on December 31, 2010.
2. The team can have a maximum of 16 players (this includes two-non-native players).
3. If the two non-Aboriginal players and Rep Team (Mustangs AA/AWG Team) players rule is broken, then the game will be counted as a loss for the team.
4. Youth Players must have their parent or guardian's permission and signature on the entry form to play. If a player does not have a parent or guardian's signature on the Entry Form prior to the start of their first game, they will not play.
5. First Nation and Inuit Players must have proof of First Nation or Inuit Ancestry attached to the Entry Form. The proof must include the date of birth for the player.
6. The two non-native players must attach their Health Care Card for proof of age and permanent residence.
7. There will be **no checking allowed**. This rule will be strictly enforced!!! If a player receives a checking penalty they will be removed from the game.
8. No slap shots allowed.
9. Any player penalized for hitting from behind will be removed from the game.
10. If a player receives more than two penalties, they will be removed from the game.
11. Fighting is not allowed in the Youth Division. A player receiving a fighting penalty will be removed from the tournament and may be suspended from playing in future YIHA youth tournaments.
12. All other Whitehorse Minor Hockey Rules (BCAHA rules) apply.
13. The coach is responsible for their players. If there are any difficulties with a player(s) at the arena, the coach and the player(s) will be spoken to and could have their passes removed.

A. Warm Up Time

Due to the importance of staying on time, the warm up will be 5 minutes in length which starts at the scheduled start time on the schedule.

B. Period Times

Regular Games and Semi-Finals

1st Period: 20 Minutes straight time

2nd Period: 20 Minutes straight time

3rd Period: 15 minutes straight time and the last 5 minutes stop time.

Final Games

1st Period: 20 minutes straight time

2nd Period: 20 Minutes straight time

3rd Period: 15 Minutes Stop time

The ice will be cleaned every second period

C. Overtime

If the score is tied at the end of regulation time, there will be a four on four for five (5) minutes straight time or sudden death victory.

If the score is tied at the end of the five (5) minute overtime period, there will be a five (5) player shootout. A coin toss will decide who shoots first.

If the score is tied after five (5) player shoot out, there will be one new shooter for each team until there is a victory.

If Team A has fewer players than Team B and if Team A has exhausted all its players in the shootout, Team A can then reuse its players again. Team B will also have the opportunity to use its same players again if this was to occur. This will repeat itself every time Team A has exhausted its players in the shootout!

D. Grace Time

Due to the importance of staying on schedule, a team will be allowed five (5) minutes grace time from the starting time on the schedule;

After the 5 (5) minutes grace time, one (1) goal will be awarded every five (5) minutes to the full team who is on the ice; and

At the end of one (1) period of elapsed time, the team which is unable to ice their team will forfeit the game;

Teams must have a minimum of six (6) players on the ice including the goalie.

E. Protests

The only protest able items are eligibility issues (Aboriginal Status, Rep Team (Mustangs AA/AWG players), etc). All on ice calls made by the referee will stand and will not be heard by the protest committee.

Any protest must be made **Prior** to the start of the second (2nd) period of the Game in which is being protested.

Protest can only be made by the coach or manager listed on the registration form.

In order for the protest to be heard, **\$200 cash** must first be given to the YIHA Protest committee.

The \$200 protest fee will be either: (protest form included in team package)

- A.** Reimbursed to the coach/manager if the decision is in-favor of the disputing team
- B.** Lost, if the decision is against the disputing team.
- C.** The YIHA Protest Committee decision is **final!**

The protest committee will be made up of one YASC member, One YIHA member and one Referee

By signing this entry form, the Parents or Guardian agree that:

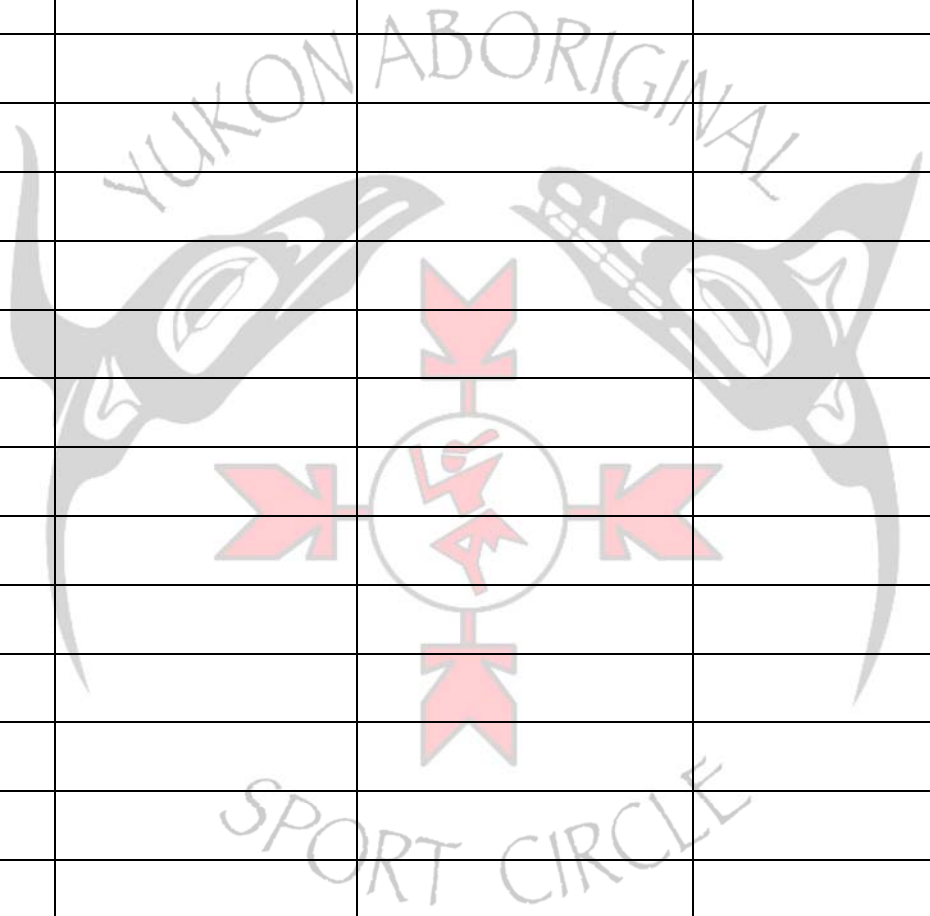
